

BURSARIES ISoP 2009

The International Society of Pharmacovigilance (ISoP) offers some financial assistance to **young researchers in pharmacovigilance from emerging countries*** (maximum age 40 years, from universities or research institutions) and **full-time students** (maximum age 30 years) who wish to attend the 9th ISoP Annual Meeting in Reims, France, 6-9 October 2009.

To be eligible for a grant, an applicant:

- must be member of ISoP (or have applied for membership of ISoP by 27 July, 2009)
- must be presenting an oral or poster communication at the Annual Meeting (one applicant per abstract will be accepted)
- Consecutive successful applications from previous ISoP meetings may be considered but **first time applicant will be given priority**

Applications for Bursaries:

Delegates who may be eligible should apply to the Grants Committee by e-mailing administration@isoponline.org with

- an application letter with reference submitted abstract number (s)
- a short Curriculum Vitae describing current active work
- one reference from a supervisor
- full time students must also supply proof of full time student status

The application letter should also describe the support needed to cover expenses. For the successful applicants, reimbursement will be made by bank transfer upon receipt of invoices/travel expenses **after the conference**.

ISoP will ask you to write a short report on your experience at the ISoP 2009, or to disseminate the information you have learnt to a wider scientific body in your country.

The deadline for applications is 27 July, 2009. If the application with requested documents is not received by 27 July, 2009, it may not be accepted for consideration by the Grants Committee.

ISoP will inform applicants of the outcome of their application by the beginning of August 2009.
